
The Night Gardener

Nobody Owens, known to his friends as Bod, is a normal boy. He would be completely normal if he didn't live in a sprawling graveyard, being raised and educated by ghosts, with a solitary guardian who belongs to neither the world of the living nor of the dead. There are dangers and adventures in the graveyard for a boy. But if Bod leaves the graveyard, then he will come under attack from the man Jack, who has already killed Bod's family.

He figures Brody's probably just trying to scare him since he's the new kid. But when Erica disappears into the woods one day, he knows something is terribly wrong.

Staying with their aunts over the summer, Neil Cady, his sister Bree, and their new friends Wesley and Eric, set out to explore Greylock Hall, an abandoned psychiatric hospital which is supposed to be haunted by the ghost of Nurse Janet.

When one of their cases goes horribly wrong, Lockwood & Co. have one last chance of redemption. Unfortunately this involves spending the night in one of the most haunted houses in England, and trying to escape alive.


Anna Dressed in Blood by Kendare Blake Y/Fic/Blake


Through the Woods by Emily Carroll Y/Graphic/Through

When fourteen-year-old Alex is framed for murder, he becomes an inmate in the Furnace Penitentiary, where brutal inmates and sadistic guards reign, boys who disappear in the middle of the night sometimes return weirdly altered, and escape might just be possible.

The Spill claimed Addison's parents and scarred her little sister, Lexa, who hasn't spoken since. 
# Three Dark Crowns (Three Dark Crowns #1) by Kendare Blake Y/Fic/Blake

A breathtaking and spine-tingling novel about three teenage girls who face off against an insidious monster that preys upon young women.




Dread Nation
