# The Great Trouble by Deborah Hopkinson J/Fic/Hopkinson





## Restart by Gordon Korman Y/Fic/Korman






### Family Game Night and Other Catastrophes by Mary E. Lambert J/Fic/Lambert







### Jake the Fake Keeps it Real by Craig Robinson, Adam Mansbach J/Fic/Robinson









### Liar & Spy by Rebecca Stead J/Fic/Stead




