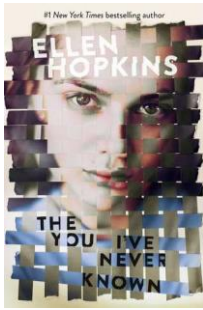
Be True to Me

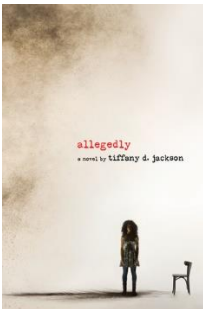
The You I've Never Known

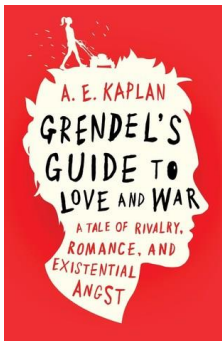
Allegedly

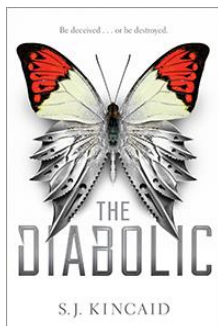
Grendel's Guide to Love and War

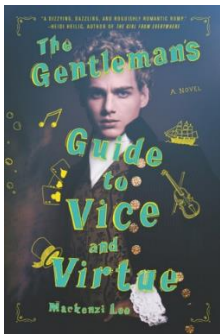
The Hundredth Queen

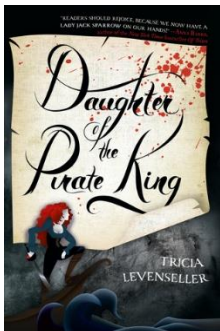
The Gentleman's Guide to Vice and Virtue

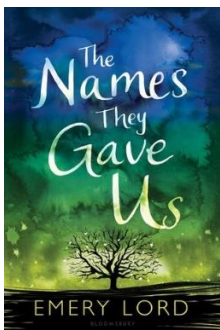

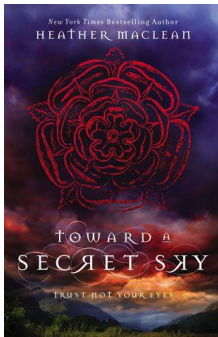
The Names They Gave Us

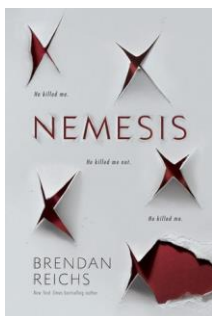
Liberty: The Spy Who (Kind of) Liked Me

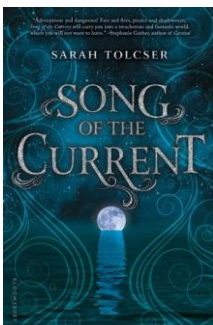


The Hate U Give

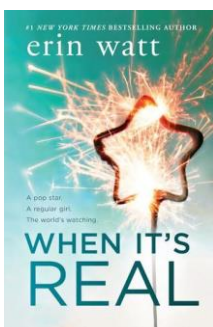


Song of the Current (Song of the Current #1)

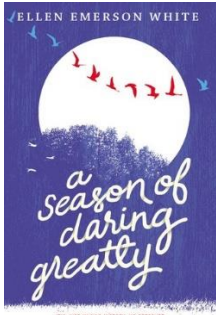


When It's Real

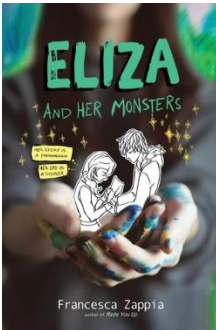
A Season of Daring Greatly
